Medical equipment for maternity deliveries and the construction of a delivery room at Phnom Dei Health Centre, Phnom Shrok District, Banteay Meanchey Province, Cambodia

Date grant accepted: 9th May 2018 (GBP 9,905)

BACKGROUND

A grant from Eagle Foundation is supporting Phnom Dei Health Centre to ease overcrowding and make improvements the standard of care offered to vulnerable women in its catchment. The Health Centre was constructed in 1997 and there have been few improvements since. When IMPACT Cambodia first surveyed the Health Centre last year, they found lack of space to be the main challenging factor, with just one small room used for deliveries and post-partum care. Overcrowding and the pressures of space also mean that there is frequently no room for women to rest and undergo health checks after delivery. And lack of basic delivery equipment creates challenges for medical staff and heightens the risk of injury or even death when there is a complicated delivery. 'Things have been hazardous for years whenever the delivery happens two women at the same time. One mother has to stay and wait, even though there is no proper waiting space, or else be transferred quickly to a health centre in another village community, which is not ideal. This was seen by the villagers and it became known that Phnom Dei is not a safe place where they can come for delivery service'—IMPACT Cambodia.

PROJECT UPDATE

On receipt of your grant, IMPACT Cambodia began work with Phnom Dei's Medical Director, Dr Tep Kannara, to identify a local contractor to build a new maternity unit in the hospital grounds. The design brief was to erect a small, two roomed building to be used for deliveries and post-partum care. The old space will continue to be used for some post-natal services and birth-spacing education. Building work commenced on 24th August 2018. It has taken a little longer to complete the project due to the very heavy rains in September but the building is now on course to be completed and opened by the end of November.





A traditional Buddhist ceremony was held by Dr Tep Kannara and the staff to bless the land on which the birthing unit would be built and pray for good fortune for the mothers and babies who will be delivered there.

'The staff feel very blessed to receive your support. It has been very difficult for us in the past. Women had to transfer from place to place just because we did not have enough space to help them, or the correct equipment. Now, they will be safe in delivery and enjoy comfort of the new building, which will no longer be hectic and overcrowded. Thank you so much for seeing the need in this area and for transforming our Health Centre into a place where people feel comfortable to come to during their hard times.' - Dr Tep Kannara

NEXT STEPS

As this report is being prepared, the building is in the very final stages of internal decoration and will be ready to accept patients by the end of November 2018. **The maternity equipment**, which formed part of this proposal, has been purchased and some of the smaller items are already in use in the old building, such as the infant weighing scales and delivery instruments. As soon as the new building is completed the rest of the equipment will be formally installed. We look forward to sending you an update soon

'I am glad that Phnom Dei finally have new delivery equipment. The scale is very modern, I have never seen that before. People in the village used to complain about the lack of equipment issue in the Health Centre. In the future, if I have to delivery, I will definitely come back again because it is so near and the new building is almost finished as well.'
