Introduction:

This funding was to enable us to support the local communities in which we work with their preparations for Covid-19. This was done in conjunction with a community awareness campaign to educate rural Malawians about the importance of social distancing and handwashing.

The Fondation Eagle funding was to be used for:

- the purchase of soap and buckets where people gather. This would enable these to be placed in areas such as health centres, beach landing sites, markets etc to support the handwashing initiative
- to repair boreholes which are not functioning to increase the number of boreholes and relieve pressure on those that are still working. There are 2,271 boreholes across Nhkata Bay District with a similar quantity in Nkhotakota District and around 20% of these are broken. By repairing the boreholes, we hoped to reduce the pressure and over-crowding at the ones that are working. Repairing these would help Malawians to have easier access to water for drinking and crucially during the Covid-19 pandemic, for washing their hands.

Details of the project:

- 30,000 leaflets were produced in total and these were used by 270 Conservation
 Committees, health centres and Ripple Africa staff to make 600,000 people aware of
 how to protect themselves and their families against Covid 19 through socially
 distanced community meetings
- A 10 Day public address campaign was run in Nkhata Bay District
- A 10 Day public address campaign was run in Nkhotakota District
- 200 Buckets with taps and soap were distributed to health centres and community meeting places such as markets and beach landing sites
- 190 non functioning boreholes have been repaired in Nkhata Bay District and 50 in Nkhotakota District working in partnership with the District Councils.

Project beneficiaries:

The part of the project funded by Fondation Eagle has benefitted the following people:

- Our estimate is that each bucket purchased will be used by approximately 30 people at least once per day, benefiting a total number of 6,000 per day.
- 200 boreholes were repaired as each borehole is used by an average of 150 people, this will have benefitted 30,000 people, some visiting them several times each day.

Expenditure summary:

The funding that Ripple Africa raised from this donation and from other donors for the borehole repairs was used for purchase of the parts needed to repair the boreholes, fuel costs and a small daily food allowance for the maintenance team to undertake the repairs, and the management and supervision to ensure that the work was carried out to the correct standard. The salaries of the maintenance teams were funded by the District Councils.

The funding from Fondation Eagle was used to cover the purchase costs of the buckets and soap and the spare parts for the repairs to 200 boreholes in Nkhata Bay and Nkhotakota. The borehole repairs were more than requested, but we managed to secure the buckets and soap more cheaply. These costs are shown below. All other project costs plus the overspend on these two items have been covered by donations from other funders.
