#### **PROGRESS REPORT**

## Introduction

In December 2021 Taaro ke Bacche was pleased to announce the opening of a Pre-Vocational Unit for children and adolescents with autism. The objective of the centre is to provide comprehensive care and support to individuals with autism and to their families.

The Pre-Vocational Unit aims to equip adolescents with autism with the necessary skills to enter the workforce and lead independent lives. It will provide vocational training, life-skill training and therapy to help children and adolescents to acquire social and emotional skills, communication skills and functional living skills.

#### The Importance and impact of the Pre-vocational Unit

A Pre-Vocational Unit for autistic children and adolescents is important because it aims to equip them with the necessary skills to enter the workforce and lead independent lives. Children living with autism face unique challenges in developing social and communication skills, as well as functional living skills, which can make it difficult for them to succeed in a typical work environment.

The Pre-Vocational Unit can provide vocational training, life-skill training and therapy tailored to the needs of children and adolescents with autism. It can help them develop skills in areas such as time-management, organisation, problem-solving, communication, and social interaction, all of which are essential for success in the workplace.

By providing young people with autism with the opportunity to acquire these skills in a safe and supportive environment, a pre-vocational unit can help them build self-confidence, improve their self-esteem and boost their independence. This can have a positive impact on their overall well-being and quality of life, as well as on their ability to contribute to society in a meaningful way.

## **Achievements**

#### Commencement of the setup of Pre-Vocational Unit and Playground.

Over 2022, significant progress was made in setting up the Pre-Vocational Unit. Here are some of the milestones achieved:

**Stakeholder Engagement:** We have engaged with various stakeholders to obtain their feedback and insight into the needs of young adults with autism. We have also formed a working group comprised of a vocational trainer, carers, and educators to oversee the implementation of the project.

**Location & Environment:** We have identified a suitable location for the pre-vocational unit within our school premises and get some space to develop a garden in the same place as well. Keeping the importance of environment in our surrounding and even in the development of our kids, we have grown grass there and decorate the garden with some small and big plants. The garden is equipped with swing; slider and garden bench. The location is accessible, secure, and conducive to learning and acquisition of skills.



We also installed this playground at the same time we started the setup of the Pre-Vocational Unit. We took advantage of some of the same resources that we used for the Pre-Vocational Unit.

This offers the children a green, safe, and fun space to play and also improve their motor and physical abilities using the playground equipment.

**Infrastructure development:** We were focused on the masonry, electrical installations and plumbing in the room, all of which have been completed and verified by professionals for safety

and compliance with building codes. The prevocational room is now ready for the installation of furniture, computer equipment and other necessary material.

**Equipment and Supplies:** We have acquired some equipment and material required for starting vocational training i.e. one round table, and two folding wall mounted tables,



handicraft items, looms, office furniture, stationery and cooking utensils.

**Curriculum:** We have developed a curriculum that will meet the needs of young adults with autism, covering a wide range of vocational skills, basic accounting and customer service. We

have also included life-skills such as hygiene, cookery and time-management.

**Staffing:** We have recruited a team of qualified professionals who will oversee the pre-vocational unit's day-to-day operations. The team comprises a vocational education special educator trainer and an assistant trainer.

**The Inauguration :** April 2<sup>nd</sup> 2023 World Autism Day - was the big day! Taaro ke Bacche inaugurated its Pre-Vocational Unit for individuals with autism. The event was celebrated with great enthusiasm and started with a brief presentation on the importance of vocational training for youngsters with autism. This was followed by the official ribbon-cutting ceremony by the special guest Mr. Rajesh



Kumar Mishra and other dignitaries as Professor Parimal Das, director of the Centre for Genetic Disorders in BHU (Benares Hindu University)

There was a concert featuring local artists who performed various genres of music. It was greatly enjoyed by all and created a festive atmosphere.





Towards the end of the event there was a balloon-release, which is a symbol of hope and new beginnings

The inauguration of the pre-vocational unit was a resounding success and received positive feedback from the attendees. It was seen as a great initiative which will help individuals with autism lead an independent and fulfilling life.

#### **Continued Planning**

Over 2023, we also leveraged **existing facilities** in place such as handlooms as part of the prevocational initiative to provide a safe and functional space for our youngsters.

In addition, we had started to plan for the setup of the computer room in the pre-vocational unit. See the Expenditure Report for the estimated planned expenditure which will carry over to early 2024.

NOTE: Our earlier plans to setup a bakery facility on premise have been postponed as our priority focus now is on Computer Training.

#### Positive impact on our Teenagers

**Improved self-esteem**: Being promoted to the next phase of learning, the teenagers feel a sense of achievement and dignity giving them hope and confidence to integrate into mainstream.



Challenges

Sometimes it was challenging to adapt and deal with certain differences in the way of

local working. For example, punctuality, missing workdays, etc

Continuous budgeting and securing funds for future needs. Specifically, in 2024 one

essential requirement is a new vehicle to transport children, an important service that we provide. The current vehicle in use, purchased at the beginning of 2015, is very costly to

run and maintain, and does not have the capacity to meet the increasing demand. Given

the extension of the school and transport needs, we would need a vehicle with minimum

15 seats, and more efficient to run and maintain (running on gas instead of fuel oil). See

attached documents.

**Next Steps** 

We continue to focus on the pre-vocational program, and our immediate next step is to setup the facilities for computer training in early 2024 (we have provided estimates of related investment

expenditure for 2024).

We seek approval from Eagle to use the unspent portion of the donation received in 2022

towards this ongoing project as part of our holistic Pre-vocational program.

Conclusion

Overall, we are pleased with the progress made in setting up the Pre-Vocational Unit for adolescents with autism. We will continue to ensure the success of the project and address any

challenges that may arise.
