Project Overview

Ripple Africa has been running environmental projects in rural areas of Malawi for many years now and one of the ways in which we ensure that the projects are successful is by providing transport for our staff teams to travel to the areas in which they work so that they can carry out their duties more effectively. We have previously purchased motorbikes for other team members on the cookstove and fish conservation projects and it has significantly increased staff efficiency. We have sourced a good supplier and understand the training and registration processes necessary for their use.

Our original request was for the purchase of 12 motorbikes for project coordinators on the Changu Changu Moto fuel efficient cookstove project, the orange fleshed sweet potato project and for Dan Shaba who manages activities from our base in Nkhata Bay District. The request was also for the ancillary costs, such as training, vehicle registrations etc. The grant awarded was for the purchase of four motorbikes and eight helmets.

Project Progress

The motorbikes have all been purchased and are now in use. We were able to secure funding from another donor to enable us to purchase the other eight motorbikes and the photo below shows the new motorbikes. All staff have been fully trained.

Francis Singini (in yellow) is the sweet potato project coordinator in Nkhata Bay District and is helping 1200 householders like Joseph each year to grow orange fleshed sweet potatoes.

These are higher yielding and higher in Vitamin A than the white fleshed varieties normally grown in the area.


Joseph is delighted as he is able to get two crops a year from the vines that he is given and can also sell the leaves which are popular as a relish.



The children at the nine preschools run by Ripple Africa benefit from the sweet potato meals that they are given each day.

All the preschools have a vegetable garden where the new varieties of sweet potatoes are grown and Francis helps the teachers to ensure that they get the best crops each year from their vines.





Our Changu Changu Project team members like Alinafe and Mercy can reach more villages on their motorbikes to ensure that the project is on target and to support the community volunteers who help householders to construct and use their new fuel efficient cookstoves.



The householders are so proud of their new cookstoves that they are now decorating them!

So as well as providing a safer cooking method which uses much less wood for cooking, the changu changu motos are also becoming a design statement!
