Mary's Meals is incredibly grateful for the ongoing and continued support of the Fondation Eagle. Your dedication to our work is fundamental to realizing our vision of ensuring children facing extreme poverty and food insecurity can receive a daily meal in their place of education. Your remarkably generous donation of **51,000 CHF** is enabling us to provide stoves and pots to **125 schools** across Mambwe, Katete, Chipata and Chasefu districts in Zambia's Eastern Province. This work is vital to allow us to keep our promise to the children we serve through the provision of a daily school meal and the opportunity to build themselves a brighter future through their education.

The need for your support in Zambia:

Currently in Zambia approximately **48%** of people are unable to meet their minimum daily calorie requirements and an alarming **35% of children under the age of 5** are experiencing stunted growth. ¹ In addition to this **more than half** of Zambia's population are still living below the poverty line whilst the country faces the worst drought on record, with some regions across the country receiving **less than 50% of their usual annual rainfall.** ²

In February 2024, Zambia's president, President Hakainde Hichilema, declared the state of drought in the country as a national disaster, estimating that it is affecting the livelihoods and food security of more than **one million families.**³ Such drought, exacerbated by climate change and El Nino, has caused significant crop failures across Zambia and as the country continues to face the impacts of its worst cholera outbreak in its history over the past year, food insecurity is continuing to increase throughout Zambia.⁴

The support that Fondation Eagle is providing to children in the Eastern Province of Zambia, is crucial as poverty often prevents children from gaining a life-changing education. Mary's Meals, with your support, is helping to improve the education sector in Zambia by encouraging more children to attend school through the promise of a daily meal, as well as helping to increase concentration and their ability to participate in class. We have been working in Zambia since 2014 and are proud to be in our 10th year of implementing our school feeding programme in the Eastern Province of the country. Over the last decade, we have worked to become the main provider of school meals in the ten districts we serve. Mary's Meals is currently providing nearly 400,000 children in over 700 places of education across Zambia's Eastern Province with a daily meal, giving them the energy needed to concentrate and learn effectively. This would not be possible without your ongoing commitment to our work and your remarkable support over the years.

Your impact in Zambia:

Your support is ensuring that children like Linacy, pictured to the left. Linacy is a pupil at Chadzuma school, one of the schools you are supporting with this grant and told us how significant the meals you help provide are to her life and her education: "I started eating the porridge in 2021 when it just came here. Since then, I have been eating it every day and tastes nice! I like it because it quenches my hunger while at school and it is so satisfying. It helps me to concentrate in class and I am able to pay attention and follow what the teacher is teaching." Ensuring that Linacy's school has resources such as pots and a stove is fundamental to our school feeding programme. With your support, and with each daily meal, Linacy is one step closer to realizing her dreams for her future: "I want to be a nurse when I grow up and I am doing my best in class. Last term I passed number 5 [in her class] and I want to be number 1 in class this term." By funding new pots and stoves for Chadzuma school, Linacy can continue her education safe in the knowledge that together, we will continue to keep our promise of a daily school meal; something which is important to Linacy: "Because I am now used to the porridge and it is helping a lot in my studies, I would feel so bad if the porridge was removed from our school. It is the one [thing] that makes most of my friends come every day to school because we know that while in class, we will have something to eat at break time. I really appreciate you [Mary's Meals] for the porridge I have here at school every day."

The success of our school feeding programmes relies heavily on community ownership, leadership and participation. Volunteers, like Christine, pictured to the left, play a crucial role in ensuring that the children we serve receive their daily meals efficiently and safely. Your contribution to the purchase of pots and stoves ensures that volunteers, like Christine, who cooks at Kapepe school, have the needed support and resources to carry out their work. Speaking to Christine, we learnt why she dedicates her time to serving school meals: "I am a volunteer here at Kapepe School. I have two children learning at this school, one in grade 5 and another in Early Child Education (ECE). I started cooking in 2022 because I saw that the porridge was helping the children, and it was just a good initiative. It helps the children stay in school because in our villages not everyone can manage to provide food every day for our children to carry as they come to school." Christine noted the challenges that her community face and how your support is helping tackle them: "There is hunger in villages and for some, this porridge is all they have. I feel nice when I see the learners eating the porridge that I prepare." School feeding at Kapepe demonstrates the importance of community involvement in our school feeding programmes and highlights the need for your generous contribution as we work with communities to ensure they have the resources and equipment needed to serve meals. Christine acknowledges the significance of such community participation: "I also cook with my friend Beatrice most of the time and I want to encourage my fellow parents in our community who do not cook that they should start helping out in cooking because these are their children. Without the programme, children would suffer because there is no food in most households, so I will keep cooking for the children at school where there is food."



Sebastian, the School and Health Nutrition (SHN) Coordinator at Chadzuma School, also notes the importance of community involvement in the preparation of the school meals: "The community is very supportive of the programme and they want to see it continue because it has proved to be a game changer among learners." Sebastian, pictured to the right, went on to describe the differences he has seen in the children since the introduction of the daily meals: "I can confidently tell you that the School Feeding Programme has improved the performance of the learners at this school generally. I have seen the enrolment go up and the children turn up every day in numbers. The porridge has been helping the school run in this community. The nutritional value is really evident among the learners. Mary's Meals is helping our pupils keep up with their education in especially difficult times with the drought that has affected our country and this community." By providing pots and stoves, your support is directly impacting schools such as Chadzuma and Kapepe and ensuring that the children we serve have the opportunity to build themselves a brighter future through the promise of a daily school meal.

Updates on your support and expenditure summary:

At a time of continued economic instability and increasing food insecurity for communities in Zambia, your support over the past 6 months has been crucial to our school feeding programme. We are delighted to report that at this mid-point of your grant, all **80 stoves** and **137 pots** have been procured in alignment with our proposed project plan. They were all procured from one supplier and are currently being stored safely and securely at the Mary's Meals Zambia office in Chipata and will be distributed to all 125 schools. It is

anticipated by the end of July 2024, all the pots and stoves funded by Fondation Eagle will be in schools. We are incredibly grateful for your continued support and look forward to updating you on the success of the stoves and pots in schools at the end of this grant period. All costs for the project have now been incurred, with all stoves and pots purchased. The table below outlines these costs in line with the project proposal.
