Introduction: Enabling quality education for local children in the village of Lenjani by facilitating the completion of a half-built primary school.

Date of grant accepted: 29th November 2024

Amount: £26,687

Conversion rate, date & amount in local currency: Conversion is GBP to TZS, conversion rate correct as of 16.07.24. Conversion rate is 1 GBP = 3,453 TZS

Name and exact location of the project: Schools Completion. The village of Lenjani (population 2,300), a plateau area in the Lemanyata ward of Arusha Rural District.

Period of Project: 6 months, January 2025—June 2025

Project beneficiaries: We supported 601 children to access primary education.

Details of the project: Previously, the young children of Lenjani village were required to walk 5-8km per day to the nearest primary school in the village of Olkokola. This tiring and physically demanding journey resulted in many children dropping out of education before the last year of primary school (age 13). Now teachers are seeing a huge demand for spaces at the school, and it is anticipated that the school will be over-subscribed as early as 2026. We registered 601 new students (318 boys and 283 girls).

Three classrooms had been started prior to the project commencing and these were finished with the addition of floors, windows, paint and desks, allowing space for 150 children to receive their education. Two new classrooms which had been planned but not started, were also completed in the above timeframe with room for 100 children.





A half-finished staff office was also completed with flooring, paint and furniture. As well as this, essential plumbing work was undertaken on the toilets meaning children now have access to sanitation facilities as well as clean water and no longer have to bring their own water from home.

Follow up: Erneth, (Area Co-Ordinator), will work alongside Mondo Volunteers and villagers from Lenjani to conduct research into the difference made by the provision of the primary school. They will collect data surrounding the number of children completing primary education, with studies conducted to gain a deeper insight into the gender gap and how female students specifically are benefitting from the new opportunities. After the first year, the initial cohort of students will be asked questions about their feelings towards education, their motivations for continuing studying, and whether having access to a local school has had an impact on their ability to attend classes, as well as their overall grades, and their aspirations for the future.

Conclusion: The completion of this primary school will be lifechanging for the children of Lenjani now and for years to come, and we thank Fondation Eagle for making this possible. Primary school dropout rates in Tanzania are estimated to be around 17%, therefore the provision of easy to access

education- particularly in rural areas such as Lenjani- is crucial. With the financial support provided by Fondation Eagle, more children than ever can remain in school for longer and reach their full potential.
