Maternity Equipment for Six Health Centres in Banlung and Borkeo districts, Ratanakiri Province, Cambodia.

Introduction: Your grant has been used to equip six health centres with much-needed maternity equipment, encouraging more women to birth in a setting where medical support is on-hand in the event of complications.

Name and exact location of the project: Banlung and Borkeo districts, Ratanakiri Province, Cambodia

Period of Project: 17/04/2025 – 16/04/2026

Project beneficiaries: Since December 2025, when the equipment was fully installed and operational: 415 women have accessed antenatal care; 207 women delivered babies; and birth spacing education has been delivered to 3,741 women.

Summary of progress made so far: Following the delivery of Fondation Eagle-donated maternity equipment to the Ratanakiri Provincial Health Department in October 2025, all equipment was successfully distributed and installed across the six target health centres: Kachanh, Kon Mom, Srae Angkrong, Phnom Kok, Serng and Ting Chak. Each health centre received a delivery bed, delivery chair and delivery materials, while five centres also received a HemoCue machine to strengthen maternal health screening services. Kachanh Health Centre did not require one as it already had suitable equipment in place.

In remote parts of Ratanakiri Province, many women face significant barriers to accessing quality maternal healthcare due to poverty, distance, poor infrastructure and limited medical resources. Health centres often operate with minimal equipment, making it difficult to identify complications during pregnancy and provide

safe, timely care for mothers and newborns. Thus the introduction of the HemoCue machines has significantly improved the capacity of health centre staff to screen pregnant women for anaemia, a common condition that can lead to serious complications during pregnancy and childbirth if left untreated. The new devices allow healthcare workers to carry out rapid, on-site haemoglobin testing using only a finger-prick blood sample, providing immediate results without the need for laboratory facilities.

All the equipment provided through this grant is of high quality and was purchased from trusted local medical suppliers with whom IMPACT Cambodia has a long-standing relationship. The equipment will remain in place and continue to support women and families in these underserved communities of Ratanakiri Province for many years to come.

Expression of gratitude from Ratanakiri Provincial Health Department:

‘I have worked as a health care provider in Ratanakiri Province for more than 30 years, and I have never seen another organisation provide delivery beds not only to referral hospitals, but also to health centres. Many believe these beds are only for hospitals, not health centres. With this donation, both health care providers and patients are very happy. Delivery beds make midwives’ work easier and allow pregnant women to position themselves more comfortably. The hemocue machine is also very important for maternity care. Not all health centres in Ratanakiri have standard machines. The Ministry of Health previously supplied them, but many are now broken. Because of limited budgets, some centres buy cheaper machines that do not provide accurate results. I would like to express my gratitude to the generous donor for these donations. Both the training and medical equipment greatly contribute to improving health care services in Ratanakiri Province. Kachanh Health Centre

The Health Centre serves 21 villages with a total population of 13,095, including 2,282 women of reproductive age. *‘Even though the distance from Kachanh Health Centre to Banlung town is not so far, it is a place of hope for the people who live at the villages, especially for indigenous and vulnerable people because they prefer to seek healthcare here, rather than in the town, they feel more comfortable here’* **IMPACT Cambodia**

Under this grant, Kachanh Health Centre received one delivery bed, one delivery chair and one set of delivery materials under this project.

“There is a newfound sense of hope in our maternity ward today. Providing a mother with a clean, modern and comfortable bed to bring new life into the world is a beautiful gift. This equipment restores dignity to the birthing process and brings joy to our staffs and patients alike. Previously, we always faced difficulties with lack of equipment. Sometimes, we have to share our own money to purchase necessary materials in order to make our work easier.” – Nakry Keo, Kachanh HC’s midwife

Case story

'My house is located about 15km from Kachanh Health Center. I always came for antenatal care here. Midwives here always provide a short selfcare education during pregnancy and after delivery. My husband is a soldier. He was not with me during my pregnancy; he could visit once in every two or three months as he was on his duty at the border. I told him about my due date. He arrived two days before my delivery! The midwives took good care of me during my ante natal visit. Moreover, when I saw new and clean delivery equipment, I felt more confident and less anxious about giving birth. It gives me a sense of safety knowing that the health care workers have the right tools to care for me and my baby. This makes me trust the health care facility more and feel more comfortable during delivery' –Sreytouch Nuch, a mother who delivered at Kachanh HC



Kon Mom Health Centre

Kon Mom Health Centre is situated in Kon Mom town along the national road linking Stung Treng and Ratanakiri Provinces, approximately 35 km from Banlung, which is the provincial capital. The facility serves three of the six communes in Kon Mom District, covering 16 villages with a combined population of 18,466 people and is the largest and busiest of the health centres supported through this grant. Each month, the Health Centre provides an average of 18–30 deliveries, 130–200 prenatal consultations, 150–200 vaccinations, and 250–300 family planning consultations. Within the first week of installing the new delivery bed, six mothers safely gave birth using the newly donated equipment.



'We are highly impressed by the intuitive design of the new delivery bed. Its ease of mobility and the seamless adjustment mechanism allow our midwives to react quickly during critical moments. The craftsmanship of maternity gear is exceptional. From the sturdy frame of delivery bed to specialised accessories, every pieces feel built to last. Srae Angkrong Health Centre

Srae Angkrong Health Centre was first established as a health post in 2010 before being upgraded to a full Health Centre in 2022. Located roughly halfway between Stung Treng and Ratanakiri Provinces, the facility is around 57 km from Banlung, the provincial capital. The Health Centre provides essential healthcare services to four villages with a combined population of 10,368 people.

Since the new medical equipment was delivered, 354 women have benefited from antenatal care services, 43 deliveries have been conducted at the facility, and 576 family planning consultations have been provided. Health centre staff expressed great appreciation for the new equipment, particularly the delivery bed, which has helped improve the quality and comfort of maternal healthcare services for women in the community.

Phnom Kok Health Centre

Phnom Kok Health Centre is located in Veun Sai District along the Tonle Sesan River near the Laos border. The area is home to a diverse population, including Kreung, Lao, Chinese and Khmer communities, with Khmer people making up only a small proportion of residents. The Health Centre serves eight villages with a total population of 4,482 people, including many women and young children. Some remote villages can only be reached by boat during the rainy season, requiring health workers to travel regularly to provide outreach services and health education.

Located around 53 km from Banlung town, the Health Centre is difficult to access due to poor road conditions during both the dry and rainy seasons. Since the new maternity equipment was delivered, 130 women have benefited from antenatal services, 14 mothers have safely delivered using the new delivery bed and 648 women have attended family planning consultations. The new equipment is strengthening the Centre's ability to provide safer and higher-quality maternal healthcare to women in these remote communities.

'Delivery equipment plays a vital role in supporting health workers during childbirth. With the right tools, we can respond quickly and effectively to emergencies, ensuring better outcome as it protects both the mother and newborn. I feel grateful and encouraged after receiving this new delivery equipment from IMPACT and we are grateful to the donor. It means I can provide quality care. This support not only improves my performance but also increases trust between me and the mothers I serve. Ting Chak Health Centre

Ting Chak Health Centre, under the Borkeo Operational District, serves nine villages with a total population of 3,732, including 1,777 women. Since receiving your generous donation of equipment, 131 women have received antenatal care; 13 women have safely delivered using the new bed; and 609 women have attended for birth spacing advice.



A Mother's impression:

'This is my second delivery at Ting Chak. I had regular prenatal visit and the staffs here always provide health care service with care. During my prenatal visit, I have seen that they got new and clean equipment which made me feel more reassured and less anxious. It gave me confidence that the health care facility is well-prepared and that I will receive safe care during my childbirth. In my first delivery, I noticed that there was no delivery chair. I had lie down on the bed or sit on the urine container, but this second delivery I could use delivery chair which gave me more comfortable and safer'- Phalla Srauy, a mother who had second delivery at Ting Chak Health Centre

Serng Health Centre

Serng Health Centre is situated 25 kilometres east of Borkeo Referral Hospital and provides healthcare services to six villages with a population of nearly 4,000 people, including 1,996 women. Since opening in 2016, the facility has become an important source of maternal and primary healthcare for the surrounding communities. Thanks to your generosity, the Health Centre received a delivery bed, delivery chair, delivery materials and its very first HemoCue machine. Since receiving the new equipment and furniture, 118 women have attended antenatal care services, 12 deliveries have taken place at the facility, and 590 women have accessed family planning consultations. The new equipment has significantly improved the Centre's ability to provide safer and higher-quality maternal healthcare services.

'Receiving this equipment from IMPACT Cambodia sends a powerful message to our community that maternal health matters. Seeing such modern, reliable tools in our clinic builds immense trust with local families, encouraging more women to seek professional care for safe deliveries. The arrival of this high-standard maternity equipment marks a significant upgrade for our facility. This contribution is highly valued. Conclusion

The maternity equipment provided through your generous grant is already making a meaningful difference to maternal healthcare services across the six target health centres in Ratanakiri Province. In communities where access to quality healthcare remains limited by distance, poverty and poor infrastructure, the introduction of new delivery beds, delivery chairs, delivery materials and HemoCue machines has strengthened the ability of health workers to provide safer, more dignified and more effective care for mothers and newborns. Health staff are consistently reporting increased confidence in their work, and mothers have greater trust and reassurance when accessing services at their local health centres.

The results achieved so far clearly demonstrate the importance of investing in practical, high-quality medical equipment for remote healthcare facilities. Since the equipment was installed, hundreds of women have benefited from antenatal care, family planning consultations and safer deliveries using the newly donated equipment. IMPACT Cambodia and the Ratanakiri Provincial Health Department extend their sincere gratitude to Fondation Eagle for supporting this initiative and helping improve maternal healthcare for vulnerable communities in northeastern Cambodia. The equipment will continue to serve women and families for many years to come, contributing to safer pregnancies, safer deliveries and healthier futures across the Province. Thank you.
