Duration of project:

School term 2, that began from October, 2020 to January 2021, due to lockdown restrictions

Estimated number of beneficiaries:

210 children directly benefitted from the grant, but the donation had a broader impact with the entire family & the extended family benefitting, as can be evidenced by the 'bio-data' reports that show the school fees are often paid for by the extended family.



Project background:

Like many African countries, Kenya has been severely impacted by the Covid pandemic. Despite some easing in lockdown restrictions from the date of acceptance of this project, there has been an almost total cessation of the tourist, retail, & construction industries & any business relying upon the Port of Mombasa. There is no furlough system in Kenya & thus, tens of thousands of people are out of work with ensuing food deprivation & poverty.

All schools were closed in 2020, which led to more children being on the streets & created restlessness among the large teenage & younger adult population. It is considered vital that younger children should be returned to school as soon as possible to continue their education & be fed one meal a day whilst there. They should not be on the streets because their parents can no longer afford to educate them in such difficult times.

The Ananda Marga Academy & Sister Didi, who manages the girls home & school are very well known to the MEAK Directors, who have supported the facility for over 20 years. The home looks after 22 orphaned or abandoned girls & is financially supported by a small surplus that is generated from the primary school that educates approximately 500 children within the Ananda Marga compound. The parents of these children pay approximately £35 a term for their education & daily lunch at the school.

The pandemic has resulted in a significant number of parents becoming unemployed and unable to afford school fees. This could result in children dropping out of school & having the secondary effect of negatively impacting the girl's home. Over the years this home has saved literally hundreds of young (& sometimes very young) abandoned & vulnerable girls, giving them a safe, secure & homely environment to be brought up in, much in contrast to some of the deprived & abusive situations from which they have come.



Project report:

Unsurprisingly, the project was embraced by the community. Families applied for the funding & were vetted and accepted based on need.

Below is the project report letter from Sister Didi & some of the 'bio data' from the families on which they were selected to be recipients of the funding. The remaining bio data is included as appendices to this report.

RE: Follow up on School Fees Programme

Once again, we thank the Foundation Eagle for their assistance to the needy parents of Kiembeni Estate, Mombasa. We had received the kind donation for School Fees Programme (for 200 school children) and a further donation for Children's Home basic needs on 22nd June, 2020. At that time, everyone expected that the schools would open in July or August. It was then pushed forward to September and finally to October. We all understand what a difficult time everyone is having due to the loss of lives and livelihoods.

The Kenyan schools re-opened for limited classes only on 12th October, 2020. Secondary schools are to receive only the Form IV's and primary schools are to open with Class 8, the candidate class, and Grade 4, the first class in the New Curriculum. It was planned that other classes would join them phase wise, giving chance to the schools to meet the protocols. As of this date, there is some uncertainty about when the other classes will join; that is due to increase of cases.

Our school opened well and by this week, 55 children reported for Class 8 and 56 for Grade 4. Fortunately, we renovated part of the school hall, so that allows us to receive Grade 4 in two streams, and there is no crowding. The children are also supposed to wear masks.

We have identified 54 parents in classes 4 and 8 who are needy and invited them to receive the benefit of waiver of school fees for this term. They are very relieved and thankful!! In order to clarify the matter, we took note of the Bio Data of the benefitted children and their parents. It is important that the parents know that school fees will be charged next term. I think you will find the Bio Data forms interesting to read. It proves that your intervention has saved the parents from worry over school fees allowing them to purchase food for their children. The school is benefitted as there now is scope to pay the teachers and subsidize the lunch programme for the pupils. Teachers are grateful.

I am attaching the Bio Data forms and some photos of the beneficiaries, as well as a couple of photos showing the protocols in place. Note that about 10 parents have not yet come to fill their forms, but we are expecting them by next week.

When other classes return, we will continue to offer benefits to the most destitute of parents.

Challenges:

Several challenges have needed to be overcome to complete this project. The challenge that has had the greatest impact is the constant changeability of the Covid-19 situation.

Schools re-opened in October, but to only 2 of the 10 classes. Thus, on the preliminary report we could only issue bio-data for approximately 25% of the students who had benefitted from the programme. The remaining classes restarted on January 4th. There was a delay on collating the bio-data due to not all the children attending on the first week & because the Government introduced many new requirements that schools needed to fulfil to allow them to re-open. For example;

- Temperature checks had to be recorded for each child, each day.
- An assessment of each child in every subject needed to be completed & the results entered
 online. This was a major undertaking as the school's computer systems are inadequate & the
 software was unable to cope with the whole nation trying to upload all the results. Thus, the
 teachers were very busy & unable to complete all the family interviews to obtain the bio-data
 straight away.

All of these protocols were monitored by the Government, who sent staff to check how the new processes were being implemented, meaning they needed to be adhered to in a timely manner.

In addition to this, there were other challenges faced by the Ananda Marga organisation. These include:

Selecting the recipients of the funding:

 This was an extremely difficult task as many families were worthy of assistance. However, Sister Didi knows these families well & was able to identify which families were the worthiest of the funding.

New government rules and regulations for Covid-19:

- The government introduced new measures to address issues of transmission of Covid-19, which included:
 - Social distancing rules being employed to minimise the numbers of children in classrooms. Fortunately, some renovation was done to the main school hall which facilitated social distancing & pupil numbers did not have to be reduced.
 - Temperature checks on arrival at school;
 - Increased handwashing facilities; and
 - The use of face masks. Getting children to wear face masks is difficult in any school setting & as the photos show, the children did not always wear them correctly.
- Not all school years were allowed back, leaving some children still unable to attend school

A future challenge will be the affordability of school tuition for many of these families once this term is over & they will need to pay for schooling again.



Project impact:

This was a highly successful, low cost intervention, devised to get children from impoverished families back to school.

The bio-data forms provide great insight into the individual hardships of families & the direct impact of the pandemic upon their livelihoods in all spheres of work. It is very obvious to see just how grateful these families were for the school fees 'holiday' & how they realise already that they will need to take advantage of this to save for the next term's fees.

Budget details & summary:

The sum of £7,000 (910,000Ksh) was transferred from the MEAK account to that of the Ananda Marga Academy Kiembeni, where it was used to cover the cost of fees for 1 term for 210 pupils in need. In total 909,000Ksh was allocated, leaving an underspend of 1000Ksh, which was donated to charity

Below is a breakdown of the different years and the numbers of pupils per year. The school fees per term vary & are more expensive for the more senior pupils. The term is listed as term 2, despite starting at different times in the year. The full budget with each child's name is included as an appendix to this report. PP = pre-primary.


