

Fondation Eagle Vehicle Project 2021 Budget Underspend Report October 2022

Report on Use of Budget Underspend - Vehicle Repair Project - Providing Logistical Support for Covid 19 Outreach Programme

Donor Reference: FF 562-47

Original Project Donation: December 2020 - December 2021

Donation Amount: £24,000 of which £2,400 underspend at end of project

Location: Kisauni District, Mombasa, Kenya

Project Background

In December 2020, Fondation Eagle generously donated £24,000 towards the repair of 3 SUV's, the workhorses of the Haller Kenya operation. Repair rather

than replacement, was the most economical choice, and in line with the charity's core ethos of sustainability.



At that time, the need to transport the whole range of Haller services and interventions out to the communities, as part of the Covid 19 emergency support programme, meant total reliance on these off-road vehicles, with two required for every outreach trip. All three were in need of a complete overhaul, to be able to guarantee the lifeline of vital ongoing outreach provision, particularly crucial for the more remote communities.

Following a phased timing of works on the vehicles, to ensure the successful ongoing delivery of community pandemic support, a budget underspend of £2,400 was reported at the end of the project. The Fondation Eagle Trustees very kindly allowed us to retain this amount to support the future running costs of the vehicles, and to report accordingly once the total had been utilised.

The underspend has been used over the past 9 months to ensure the reliable running of the 3 SUV's above, enabling Haller Kenya's activities to continue as scheduled. Costs have included fuel, insurance, minor repairs and servicing – see budget below.

Haller Kenya's reliance on these workhorses has again been brought into focus, given the prolonged period of severe drought currently being experienced in the Horn of Africa, which is scheduled to extend into an historic fifth season. The development and testing of dryland agriculture techniques, provision of tree saplings, production of "drought resistant seed stock" and livestock, and intensive farmer training in the field, has helped support communities during this prolonged dry period. These vehicles are vital for the transfer of these starter packs and delivery of training, as well as the ongoing provision of the porridge programme to schools.

Project Outcomes

All 3 overhauled vehicles have been in daily use since December 2021, ensuring Haller Kenya delivers key services reliably and schedules their operations with certainty.

To date this year, the 3 vehicles have facilitated the following: -

- 18 community outreach sessions in the wider Kisauni district, with over
 600 patients in attendance, 100 + family planning prescriptions dispensed
- 18 community school visits (ages 5-14yrs), with 684 students attending reading and activity sessions
- Delivery & supervision of the daily porridge programme for 2-7 year-olds
- Community transport to the Demonstration Farm for farmer training
- Delivery and community planting of 230 trees
- Transport of drought resistant seed stock from Haller's Research Centre and associated farmer training to communities
- Focus on health education and delivery to 2 newer, very remote communities
- Transferring key staff between Haller hubs for the efficient running of programmes
